Subject: NATIONAL CEMETERY PRIVILEGES FOR RESERVISTS AND NATIONAL GUARD

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Members of the National Guard (NG) and Reserve Components (RC) are important elements of our U.S. Armed Forces Ready Reserve because they serve both community and country and they respond to domestic emergencies, overseas combat missions, humanitarian aid, counterdrug efforts, reconstruction missions and more; and as of July 31, 2021, the total reported personnel strength of the Ready Reserve was 1,007,853 (including 444,600 individuals in the National Guard); and

WHEREAS, The term "Reserve Component" refers collectively to the seven individual reserve components of the Armed Forces: the Army National Guard of the United States, the Army Reserve, the Navy Reserve, the Marine Corps Reserve, the Air National Guard of the United States, the Air Force Reserve, and the Coast Guard Reserve; and the purpose of these seven reserve components, as codified in law at 10 U.S.C. §10102, is to "provide trained units and qualified persons available for active duty in the armed forces, in time of war or national emergency, and at such other times as the national security may require, to fill the needs of the armed forces whenever more units and persons are needed than are in the regular components" and the Army National Guard and the Air National Guard also have a state role: operating under the control of their governor, they respond to various domestic emergencies, such as disasters and civil disorders; and

WHEREAS, During the Cold War era, the Reserve Components were a manpower pool that was rarely used, and from 1945 to 1989, reservists were involuntarily activated by the federal government four times, an average of less than once per decade; but tens of thousands who honorably but solely served in the NG and/or the RC are currently NOT eligible to be buried in a US Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) national cemetery because they do NOT meet at least one of the requirements in https://www.va.gov/burials-memorials/eligibility/ 1) met their legal minimum active-duty service requirements, was called up to active duty and served their full term of service, and didn't receive a dishonorable discharge, or 2) entitled to retirement pay at their time of death, or would have been entitled to retirement pay if they weren't under 60 years of age at the time of death, or 3) died while hospitalized or getting treatment at the expense of the U.S. for an injury or illness that occurred while they were performing active-duty services for training or inactive-duty training under honorable conditions, or 4) became disabled or died from a disease or injury caused—or made worse—by their service during a period of active duty for training, or 5) became disabled or died from an injury or certain cardiovascular disorders caused—or made worse—by their service during a period of inactive-duty training; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That The American Legion in a Department of California Convention assembled in Visalia, CA, on June 23-28, 2022, urges the federal government to amend Section 2402 of Title 38, United States Code, to expand interments at Veterans Affairs national cemeteries for 1) members of the Reserve Components whose service was terminated under honorable conditions; 2) members of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps of the Army, Navy, or Air Force who died under honorable conditions while a member; and 3) the spouse, minor child, or unmarried adult child of any member described above.

- The National Guard or Reserve member met their legal minimum active-duty service requirements, was called up to active duty and served their full term of service, and didn't receive a dishonorable discharge, or
- The National Guard or Reserve member was entitled to retirement pay at their time of death, or would have been entitled to retirement pay if they weren't under 60 years of age at the time of death, or
- The National Guard or Reserve member died while hospitalized or getting treatment at the
 expense of the U.S. for an injury or illness that occurred while they were performing active-duty
 services for training or inactive-duty training under honorable conditions, or
- The National Guard or Reserve member became disabled or died from a disease or injury caused—or made worse—by their service during a period of active duty for training, or
- The National Guard or Reserve member became disabled or died from an injury or certain cardiovascular disorders caused—or made worse—by their service during a period of inactiveduty training

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Veterans represent approximately 11% of the general homeless population, and 3.7% of veterans become homeless in the first five years after service

WHEREAS, Isolation and lack of social support systems are major risk factors among United States veterans leading to 1 out of 5 veterans living alone with an increased risk of going homeless if proper social support is not in place after discharge.

WHEREAS, The (FY) 2021 Department of Veteran Affairs Community Homelessness Assessment, Local Education and Networking Groups (CHALENG) report that consistent with 2020 data and with the previous 20 years of data, unmet needs of veterans are primarily services that VA cannot provide directly.

WHEREAS, CHALENG sites eight of the ten unmet needs continue to be housing for veterans who need to register as sex offenders, and legal assistance in the areas of court fees/court fines, credit issues/debt collection, expunging criminal records, child support, family law, discharge upgrade appeals, and tax issues. It sites six of the ten met needs continue to be medical services, mental health services, case management, food, TB testing, and substance abuse treatment.

WHEREAS, Several studies have identified unemployment as one of the factors that greatly contribute to homelessness among veterans due to a combination of factors that may or may not include mental or physical problems and substance abuse

RESOLVED, That The American Legion, Department of California at Department Convention assembled in Visalia California, June 24-26, 2022, That The American Legion renew its commitment to assisting homeless veterans and their families; and be it further

RESOLVED, That The American Legion continue to support the efforts of the public and private sector agencies and organizations with resources necessary to aid homeless veterans and their families; and, be it further

RESOLVED, That THE American Legion seek and support any legislative or administrative proposal that will provide medical, rehabilitative and employment assistance to homeless veterans and their families; and, be it finally

WHEREAS, The American Legion supports veteran-owned and service-disabled veteran-owned small business development, growth, entrepreneurship, and preference in government contracting; and

WHEREAS, The federal government has the obligation to minimize tax burdens for veterans, active-duty military personnel, and their families; and

WHEREAS, The American Legion has historically supported enhancements to the Work Opportunity Tax Credit program that would increase incentives for businesses to hire veterans, service-disabled veterans, and active-duty military spouses; and

WHEREAS, Tax relief is an important policy mechanism for ensuring a conducive economy that allows for veteran-owned small businesses and military families to achieve their financial goals; and

WHEREAS, Tax reform provides a unique opportunity to provide financial support to military families and ensure that they have flexibility when filing their taxes; and

WHEREAS, Fiscal policy encompasses a wide variety of issues that have the potential to impact the lives of veterans, active-duty service members, and their families; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That The American Legion, Department of California at Department Convention assembled in Visalia California, June 24-26, 2022, That The American Legion broadly supports tax policies that benefit veterans, veteran small businesses, active-duty service members, and military families.

E. MEASLES

REGULATIONS

Based on the Uniform Code of Procedure for the Organization of National Conventions of The American Legion, adopted by the National Executive Committee at its October 1956 meeting, the following regulations have been established for the procedure of Convention Resolutions:

- Each must emanate from a Department after favorable action or from the National Executive Committee, or from any Convention Standing or Special Committee. Resolutions submitted in advance of the Convention by Departments and the National Executive Committee shall be filed with the National Adjutant, who shall refer them to the National Convention Resolutions Assignment Committee.
- 2. The National Adjutant shall maintain a Convention register of all resolutions received, assigned and processed which shall identify each resolution by number, indicating the committee to which the resolution was referred and the originating source.

In submitting resolutions, the following points should be carefully observed:

- A resolution shall deal with only one subject. Do not attempt to deal with more than one subject in the RESOLVING clauses.
- b. All local RESOLVING clauses are to be omitted, substituting therein a clause resolving national action, i.e. the resolution as submitted should be worded for the National Convention as follows:

RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, August 30, 31, September 1, 2022, That —

If the resolving clause is not stated as above (using convention business session dates) it necessitates having to re-write the resolution to show the proper resolving clause.

- c. Each resolution is to be worded in full, including all WHEREAS clauses as well as the RESOLVING clauses.
- d. Each resolution is to be signed in black ink and the originating source clearly typewritten or indicated, unless it is submitted as a computer file. Then the originating source is to be placed in the footer of the form.
- 3. In accordance with Resolution No. 21, adopted by the National Executive Committee in regular meeting assembled on May 4-5, 2016, each resolution should be supported by the identification of the individual or group originating the resolution, and also by a written statement or brief containing the supporting arguments in favor of the action sought, and clearly establishing the material relevance of the subject to the purpose for which The American Legion was formed.
- 4. In accordance with Resolution No. 50, adopted by the National Executive Committee in regular meeting assembled on May 5-6, 1965, resolutions adopted by Departments and destined for consideration by the National Convention shall be forwarded to the National Adjutant, to be in his hands fourteen (14) days prior to the opening session of the National Convention. The only exception to this provision shall be in instances where Department Conventions are held at such time that it becomes physically impossible to comply with this provision, in which instances, the resolutions shall be forwarded to the National Adjutant immediately upon the adjournment of the Department Convention.

5. The National Convention Resolutions Assignment Committee may return through the Secretary of the National Convention to the source, inappropriate or non-germane resolutions that may be resubmitted, when corrected, to the National Executive Committee or National Convention by the originator. Inappropriate or non-germane resolutions include, but are not limited to: Convention resolutions (1) containing more than one subject, (2) calling for or requiring the expenditure of funds, (3) containing personal attacks or derogatory characterizations, (4) outside the purview, (5) not pertinent or inappropriate for action by the National Convention or (6) unclear and undocumented. Deficient resolutions, once corrected, in order to be reconsidered, need to be resubmitted to the National Convention or National Executive Committee as provided in the National Constitution & By-Laws.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs reports that 1.5 million veterans live in poverty, and their poverty rates are rising leading to increased risks of food insecurity and decreased ability to maintain healthy living; and

WHEREAS, In 2019, 17.4 million veterans lived in the United States, of whom three-fourths were of working age due to the fact that one of the fastest growing and youngest groups of veterans are those who served after September 11, 2001, and are more likely to have a service-connected disability; and

WHEREAS, A report summary from the Economic Research Service (ERS) of the U.S. Department of Agriculture found that in 2015-2019, 11.1 percent of working-age veterans lived in food insecure households, and 5.3 percent lived in households with very low food security causing disruptions in normal eating patterns; and

WHEREAS, ERS also found that food insecure households among working-aged veterans differed by periods of service, length of service, educational attainment, metropolitan status, labor for participation, household composition and disability status; and

WHEREAS, Food insecurity was higher among working-aged veterans who were disabled (33.6 percent), unemployed (20,0 percent) and female (13.5 percent), but declined with the number of active duty periods and educational attainment; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That The American Legion, Department of California at Department Convention assembled in Visalia California, June 24-26, 2022, That The American Legion support legislation that facilitates solutions that effectively addresses the unique circumstances that lead to food insecurity among veterans; and be it finally

RESOLVED, That The American Legion supports legislation that secures the availability of food resources and systems that serve as a pipeline in getting nutrition to veterans who are experiencing or at risk of food insecurity.

T E MEASURS

REGULATIONS

Based on the Uniform Code of Procedure for the Organization of National Conventions of The American Legion, adopted by the National Executive Committee at its October 1956 meeting, the following regulations have been established for the procedure of Convention Resolutions:

- Each must emanate from a Department after favorable action or from the National Executive Committee, or from any Convention Standing or Special Committee. Resolutions submitted in advance of the Convention by Departments and the National Executive Committee shall be filed with the National Adjutant, who shall refer them to the National Convention Resolutions Assignment Committee.
- The National Adjutant shall maintain a Convention register of all resolutions received, assigned and processed which shall identify each resolution by number, indicating the committee to which the resolution was referred and the originating source.

In submitting resolutions, the following points should be carefully observed:

- A resolution shall deal with only one subject. Do not attempt to deal with more than one subject in the RESOLVING clauses.
- b. All local RESOLVING clauses are to be omitted, substituting therein a clause resolving national action, i.e. the resolution as submitted should be worded for the National Convention as follows:

RESOLVED, By The American Legion in National Convention assembled in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, August 30, 31, September 1, 2022, That —

If the resolving clause is not stated as above (using convention business session dates) it necessitates having to re-write the resolution to show the proper resolving clause.

- c. Each resolution is to be worded in full, including all WHEREAS clauses as well as the RESOLVING clauses.
- d. Each resolution is to be signed in black ink and the originating source clearly typewritten or indicated, unless it is submitted as a computer file. Then the originating source is to be placed in the footer of the form.
- 3. In accordance with Resolution No. 21, adopted by the National Executive Committee in regular meeting assembled on May 4-5, 2016, each resolution should be supported by the identification of the individual or

group originating the resolution, and also by a written statement or brief containing the supporting arguments in favor of the action sought, and clearly establishing the material relevance of the subject to the purpose for which The American Legion was formed.

- 4. In accordance with Resolution No. 50, adopted by the National Executive Committee in regular meeting assembled on May 5-6, 1965, resolutions adopted by Departments and destined for consideration by the National Convention shall be forwarded to the National Adjutant, to be in his hands fourteen (14) days prior to the opening session of the National Convention. The only exception to this provision shall be in instances where Department Conventions are held at such time that it becomes physically impossible to comply with this provision, in which instances, the resolutions shall be forwarded to the National Adjutant immediately upon the adjournment of the Department Convention.
- 5. The National Convention Resolutions Assignment Committee may return through the Secretary of the National Convention to the source, inappropriate or non-germane resolutions that may be resubmitted, when corrected, to the National Executive Committee or National Convention by the originator. Inappropriate or non-germane resolutions include, but are not limited to: Convention resolutions (1) containing more than one subject, (2) calling for or requiring the expenditure of funds, (3) containing personal attacks or derogatory characterizations, (4) outside the purview, (5) not pertinent or inappropriate for action by the National Convention or (6) unclear and undocumented. Deficient resolutions, once corrected, in order to be reconsidered, need to be resubmitted to the National Convention or National Executive Committee as provided in the National Constitution & By-Laws.
